Dear Madam Mayor:

Thank you for your letter dated September 7, 2021, regarding bicycle safety and the availability of related signage and educational materials. The Department of Public Works (PW) does not have educational materials related to bicycle safety. However, we provide grants to the Ecology Action Centre (EAC) which administers bicycle safety programs for youth across the province. I expect the EAC would be a good resource for the materials you requested. Michael Croft, our Manager of Traffic Engineering and Road Safety, oversees the EAC grants. You may contact him directly at Michael.Croft@novascotia.ca for more information on EAC contacts who may be able to assist with educational materials.

Regarding bicycle safety signage, PW installs standard signs as identified in the *Nova Scotia Traffic Signage Regulations* to provide traffic control guidance to cyclists and to delineate bicycle-only lanes. In addition to these regulatory signs, there are warning signs for drivers under certain conditions such as areas where shoulders used by cyclists are narrowed or locations with bicycle trail crossings. In areas where roads have been formally designated as a part of a bicycle route, there is often guide signage used to assist cyclists who may be unfamiliar with the area.

I trust the above information addresses your queries pertaining to bicycle safety.
