Low-Cost, Door-to-Door, All-Ages Transportation

Affordable door-to-door transportation has become a reality for residents of all ages in the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg (MODL). Non-profit Lunenburg County Wheels now offers its weekday pre-booked rides to and from the towns of Bridgewater, Lunenburg and Mahone Bay as well.

MODL has provided significant operational funds, a 7-passenger minivan, and a subsidy to keep long-distance fares affordable. The subsidy keeps the highest return fare between any two points in western Lunenburg County (e.g. North River to Cherry Hill, or Chelsea to Blue Rocks) to \$15 round trip. Short, one-way trips begin at \$2.50.

In addition to the minivan, the LC Wheels' fleet recently expanded to include four new 8-passenger accessible vans funded largely by the federal government (\$345,600 through its Rural Transit Solutions Fund), plus \$86,000 from the Province of Nova Scotia.

"It's wonderful to offer affordable transportation to more communities and more people," said LC Wheels' president, Jerome Tanner. (continued on page 3)

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**Mayor's Corner**

Recently, we celebrated a significant funding announcement for Osprey Village. Osprey Village is a joint private sector and municipally-owned commercial and residential development park spanning 220-acres. It is strategically located near Exit 12 off Highway 103, in Cookville.

First, the expansion of the Cookville Wastewater Treatment facility will increase treatment capacity and accommodate future residential and commercial growth. The total assessment value of Osprey Village has experienced significant year over year increases. Over the last 12 months, the value has risen 23%, with an additional 60% increase expected in the next 36 months.

In addition to commercial development, Osprey Village continues to experience our highest growth rate in residential building permits. We expect this residential growth to continue with the new Stonemont Retirement Living Complex (200 units) and the potential for 500 residential units being constructed over the next 5 years, including several affordable housing units. By 2027, Osprey Village will be home to over 900 residents.

The second project, sidewalks on Nathan Cirillo and Pine Grove Road, is an important project for the safety and well-being of area residents. As Osprey Village continues its development with increased residents and senior populations, safe pedestrian travel is becoming a significant necessity. The project will be built to AAA accessibility standards, linking Ecole de la Rive-Sud, our future Community Hub, the Municipal Services Building, and Stonemont Retirement Living complex, and the commercial section of Osprey Village.

I want to thank the Government of Nova Scotia for their continued investment in this region.

"Riders not only use our door-to-door service for medical appointments and shopping but for social visits as well. Schools increasingly use us for individual or small group needs. Seniors and others have access to the LCLC for swimming or walking the track."

Manager Daron Lantz reports to an eight-member volunteer Board led by Tanner. Staff include a dozen part-time drivers and a dispatcher. Beyond fares and government support, funding for LC Wheels comes from long-term sponsors such as United Way (Lunenburg County), the South Shore Regional Hospital Auxiliary and the Bridgewater Lions.

Lunenburg County Wheels is an evolution of Bridgewater Senior Wheels, which provided door-to-door accessible service limited to seniors and persons with disabilities in Bridgewater and nearby MODL communities for more than thirty years. Primary funding for the expansion of the Senior Wheels Association to all ages and abilities throughout western Lunenburg County as "Lunenburg County Wheels" comes from Nova Scotia's Department of Public Works.

"After over a year of planning, there is a sense of accomplishment on our Board in expanding our service to all western Lunenburg County," said Tanner. "We could not have accomplished it without the support of our drivers, community sponsors, volunteers, governments, our clients—and our Board members themselves. Many thanks to MODL for helping to make it happen."

Property Tax Rebate Increased Significantly

To help make life more affordable for homeowners that are struggling financially, the Municipality has expanded the Property Tax Rebate program.

The Property Tax Rebate Program is one of the ways that Council supports lower-income homeowners by granting a property tax rebate based on total household income. Homeowners with household incomes under \$51,840 are eligible to receive a rebate of up to \$650. This represents a 14% increase over the 2023 amounts. "We recognize that this is a very difficult environment for lower-income property owners," says Mayor Carolyn Bolivar-Getson. "The Property Tax Rebate is one of the many ways the Municipality supports our residents encountering financial difficulties. Increasing the rebate amounts and thresholds will result in an estimated return of \$753,400 to the residents who need the relief the most."

Qualified applicants will see the rebate on their final property tax bill for the year. Applicants need to apply every year. Proof of income is required. Updated application forms are available at modl.ca/property-tax-exemptions.html. Applications are due by August 1; however, the Municipality will accept applications all year if funding permits.

2024 Municipal & CSAP Election

The Municipal and Conseil scolaire acadien provincial (CSAP) election will be held on Saturday, October 19, 2024. Voting in the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg will be by phone and internet voting only as directed by Council on April 9. There will be no paper ballots. Early voting will begin at 12 pm on Thursday, October 10, 2024, and will continue 24/7 until 7 pm on Saturday, October 19.

Voter Help Centres will be set up to assist voters if required or provide the means to vote throughout the voting period. The Voter Help Centre at the Elections Office will be open during regular office hours Monday to Friday excluding holidays beginning Thursday, October 10. As well, it will be open on Saturday, October 19, from 8 am to 7 pm. A Voter Help Centre will be set up in each district on Saturday, October 19, from 8 am to 7 pm. A complete list of Voter Help Centres will be available on the MODL website once nominations close. Or, you may vote from the comfort of your own home.

MODL voters will elect 10 Councillors and 1 Mayor. Please note that MODL district boundaries have changed for this election and maps reflecting these changes are available on the MODL website at modl.ca/electoral-districts.html. The district you were in previously may not be the same for 2024 and beyond.

Conseil scolaire acadien provincial (CSAP) qualified voters will elect 1 representative. The CSAP district includes the District of Lunenburg, District of Chester, Region of Queens, and the Towns of Bridgewater, Mahone Bay, and Lunenburg. Information will be available at rive-sud.ednet.ns.ca.

Nomination packages for both MODL councillor and mayor offices as well as the CSAP representative will be available in early July. Nominations may be filed with the Returning Officer beginning August 29 by appointment only. Nominations will close at 5 pm on Tuesday, September 10. If further information on the election is required, please contact Leah Zinck, Returning Officer, by calling or texting (902) 527-8151 or by emailing elections@modl.ca.

Electors may check to see if they are on the List of Electors beginning in August by calling the Elections office or sending an email. This is particularly important for those who have moved in the last four years, those who are 18 and voting for the first time in the municipal election, those whose mailing address has changed, etc. In early October, a Voter Information Letter (VIL) containing a unique Personal Identification Number (PIN), instructions on how to vote, and candidate names will be mailed to each qualified elector who is on the List of Electors. An elector will NOT be able to vote without the unique PIN contained in the Voter Information Letter.

The MODL Elections Office (Returning Office) will be open to the public from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday excluding holidays beginning in August. The location and office phone number will be posted at modl.ca/elections when it becomes available.

Solving Nova Scotia's Housing Challenge, Together

Nova Scotia is facing a housing availability and affordability challenge. New housing supply is the solution.

The Government of Nova Scotia offers several housing programs to create new housing supply, preserve existing affordable housing and homes, and affordability programs to support residents whether they are a first-time homebuyer or need help paying their rent. Two of these programs are designed to support homeowners as part of the housing supply solution.

Launched in November 2023, the Secondary and Backyard Suite Incentive Program is designed to encourage homeowners to add a new suite within or attached to their primary residence or on the same property as their home. The program provides homeowners with a forgivable loan of up to \$40,000 or 50% of their eligible costs for the construction of their suite. The loan can be forgiven over a five-year period if the homeowner rents the unit at an affordable rent or rents to a family member where the homeowner or the tenant is either 65 years of age or older or has a disability.

It is estimated that there are close to 130,000 empty bedrooms in houses across Nova Scotia. Happipad, a non-profit company, is dedicated to creating a safe, seamless, and enjoyable experience for individuals seeking to share their homes. Happipad provides an easy solution to connect homeowners with empty bedrooms to renters looking for a home. Through the website homeowners and renters answer a series of questions designed to ensure the perfect match. Happipad completes rigorous background checks on both homeowners and renters, provides rental agreements, handles automatic rent payments, and provides support if any issues arise. Through an investment from the Government of Nova Scotia, Happipad is a free service for homeowners and renters through to 2025.

Whether you are looking for new income opportunities, seeking to house a family member, looking for companionship, or you just want to be part of the housing solution, consider whether these programs may be the right fit for you.

Preparing for an Active Hurricane Season



The 2024 Atlantic hurricane season is expected transition to La Nina leading to more hurricanes due to the warmer waters and weaker trade winds, as per the Weather Network. The National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is predicting above-normal hurricane activity in the Atlantic basin this year. No matter the forecast, it only takes one hurricane to make it a bad year. Taking the time now to prepare, can reduce the risk for you, your family, and your pets.

Like any hazard, knowing the risks helps you plan to make your family and pets safer. Some hazards that can be expected during a hurricane include winds, rain, power outages, storm surge, coastal and/or inland flooding, road closures, evacuations, supply shortages, or downed trees.

- Hurricanes are often predicted one or two days in advance so stay informed on social media, radio, and television.
- Plan to “Shelter in Place” as you may be without power for at least 72 hours.
- Stock up and have supplies in advance. The day before Hurricane Dorian made landfall in Nova Scotia, stores were flooded with people stocking up. It is always best to plan ahead.
- Trees may have fallen during the storm. Never approach or touch a tree that is near a downed power line.
- Stay back at least 10 meters or a school bus distance away from wires or anything in contact with them. Just because there is no power to your house, does not mean that the lines do not have energy running through them.
- If there is damage to the power mast attached to your home, it must be fixed before power can be restored. Visit www.nspower.ca/outages to see what is your responsibility.
- If you use a generator, do not use it inside a building. It needs proper ventilation to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Never drive or walk through flooded roadways. Only six inches of fast-moving water can knock an adult down, and about 12 inches of moving water can sweep away most vehicles. There may also be holes or lines under the water that cannot be seen. Turn Around Don't Drown.
- Don't go down to the coastline to watch the storm. A rogue wave or surf can sweep you away and it may be unsafe for first responders to get to you.
- Officials may ask you to leave or evacuate. If you choose to stay it may be too unsafe for first responders to reach you.
- Text and emails use less bandwidth than calling or streaming social media. To reduce network congestion immediately after an emergency, avoid streaming videos, downloading entertainment, or playing video games.

Start now to prepare for your family and pets. Don't wait until the arrival of a hurricane to prepare. Make or get an emergency kit that will support your family and pets for at least 72 hours or 3 days.

Fall Wood and Metal Collection Reminder

Wood and metal pick up will take place on your regular collection day between September 16-27, 2024.

Wood and metal items are collected in the fall. Items may measure up to 1.8 m (6 feet) long and individual items may weigh up to 140 kgs (308 lbs). Each household may put out a combined volume of wood and metal measuring 4 cubic metres (5.2 cubic yards).

Wood and Metal Collection include:



Two bulky landfill items can be collected on your regular collection days, throughout the year. Items can measure up to 1.8 m and weigh up to 100 kgs.

Items include mattresses, box springs, couches, pillows, plastic furniture, rugs, carpet, toilets, acrylic bathtubs, doors with windows, vinyl siding, drywall, insulation, laundry baskets, kids swimming pools, artificial Christmas trees, ceramic lamp frames and shades. **Household waste and bulky items must be curbside by 7 am on pickup day.**

Wood and metal can be dropped off at the Waste Site located at 908 Mullock Road, Whyntott's Settlement. A fee is charged for wood, metal is free. Questions? Call (902) 543-2991 or visit communityrecycling.ca.

Additional Electronic Items Added to Provincial Recycling Program

Electronic Products Recycling Association (EPRA) has added several new types of electronics items for recycling, as of June 1, 2024.

- Floor and carpet care appliances: vacuums and carpet cleaners
- Garment care appliances: irons and steam cleaners
- Counter-top cooking appliances: food processors, coffee grinders, coffee makers
- Devices for cutting food items and opening/sealing packages
- Time measurement devices & weight scales: alarm clocks, wall clocks, food scales, weight scales
- Personal care appliances: hair dryers, electric toothbrushes
- Portable air treatment devices: portable fans, heaters, humidifiers (does not include air conditioners)



These items will no longer be collected as bulky landfill or metal items at the curbside. They will be collected during the fall electronics curbside pick up September 30 – October 11, 2024. The Waste Site at 908 Mullock Road, Whyntott's Settlement accepts these items free of charge, year-round as part of the electronics program. **For a complete list of accepted items, visit recyclemyelectronics.ca/ns/what-can-i-recycle or call (902) 543-2991.**
