Make Your Mark!

The Municipality is holding this year's election by telephone and internet voting only for the 2024 Municipal and CSAP elections to be held in October. As in 2020, there will be no paper ballots. Here's what this means for you.

Who can vote?

If you are 18 years of age and a Canadian citizen on or before October 10, "ordinarily resident" in Nova Scotia since April 9, and your primary residence has been in the District of Lunenburg as of October 9, you are eligible to be on the List of Electors and to vote in this election. If your civic or mailing address has changed since 2020 or you are voting for the first time, you are strongly encouraged to verify that your information is correct to ensure you receive a Voter Instruction Letter in early October. To find out if you are on the list, please email the Elections Office at elections@modl.ca or call (902) 530-6652.

Revisions to the List of Electors will continue throughout the election period. If you do not receive your Voter Instruction Letter by the first week of October or if the information received is incorrect, please contact the Elections Office.

When can I vote?

Voting will begin 12pm (noon) Thursday, October 10, ending 7pm Saturday, October 19 and voting can occur 24/7 during this period.

How can I vote?

All qualified electors who are on the List of Electors with a **correct** mailing address will receive a Voter Instruction Letter in early October. This letter will contain a unique Personal Identification Number (PIN) which will be required to vote either by telephone or by internet. It will also contain instructions on how to do so.

**Mayor's Corner**

Fall is upon us, and on behalf of the Municipality, I hope you had the chance to enjoy the summer months with family and friends. I also hope you had an opportunity to take part in some of our fantastic recreation programs this summer.

I am so pleased to announce the successful completion of our ambitious high-speed internet expansion project, reaching a remarkable milestone: 100% of residents are now connected to high-speed internet.

Since the project began in 2016, MODL has invested \$2,723,265, a strategic investment that was effectively leveraged to secure an estimated \$23 million in additional funding from provincial, federal, and private sources. This includes support from Develop Nova Scotia and the Government of Canada's Connect to Innovate program.

Total coverage of Eastlink or Bell Fibre in the District of Lunenburg is 98.2%. Any District of Lunenburg address not captured with Fibre could obtain a Starlink Satellite rebate. With Starlink 100% of MODL has access to High-Speed Internet above 50mbps.

Access to high-speed Internet is of critical importance to the Municipality and was a key priority for our Council for many years. This investment has made an important and significant contribution towards economic development and enhancing the quality of life in our communities.

The successful completion of this project marks a pivotal moment for the Municipality, showcasing our dedication to fostering technological growth and ensuring that all residents benefit from reliable, high-speed internet access.

The amended Municipal Planning Strategy and new Municipal-Wide Land use By-Law pertaining to Coastal Protection Regulations came into effect on August 13, 2024. If you live on the coast, we encourage you to access the documents online at modl.ca/zoning.

This issue of Municipal Matters has four pages jam packed with local community events, and I encourage you to attend some of them and get to know your neighbours, both long-term and new.

Finally, I want to extend warm back-to-school wishes to the young people of our community and hope everyone enjoys a safe and successful season ahead.

MODL2040 Project Update

The Municipality of the District of Lunenburg (MODL) has been progressively working on a land use planning project called MODL2040 over the past several years. The project was launched in 2020 and is a multi-year campaign to amend strategic planning documents such as the

Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS) and Land Use Bylaw (LUB) based on a shared vision for the Municipality up to the year 2040. While the MODL2040 project has been making progress, there have been shifts in focus due to pressing issues such as coastal protection and cluster development.



What is MODL2040?

The Province of Nova Scotia has mandated that every municipality create municipal-wide land use plans to ensure consistent planning standards province-wide. Every municipality in Nova Scotia is required to meet this minimum land use planning requirement by developing and adopting municipal planning strategies and land use bylaws that follow provincial guidelines, known as Statements of Provincial Interest. The Statements of Provincial Interest include important topics such as agriculture, drinking water, flooding, infrastructure, and housing. The Statements of Provincial Interest articulate the province's vision for protecting our land and water resources, addressing community growth, fostering economic development, and managing the effects of climate change. The MODL2040 project is how the Municipality will meet the minimum planning requirement of the province through the creation of comprehensive policies and regulations that will apply to the entire Municipality.

Updated Timeline

In 2021, the Municipality conducted a public survey to collect input from residents on the direction of the MODL2040 project. The survey provided residents with an opportunity to contribute thoughts on municipal priorities and express their vision for the future of the Municipality. The findings from the public survey were summarized into a What We Heard Report. Currently, staff are drafting policies and regulations for MODL2040, informed on research, input from relevant stakeholders, and the feedback received from residents through this survey.

The province has granted an extension to the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg for meeting the minimum planning requirement of developing municipal-wide land use plans, recognizing the recent efforts in implementing coastal protection and cluster development regulations. Municipal staff are actively working on the project and aim to bring forward draft documents in the coming months.

Once the first drafts of the MODL2040 Municipal Planning Strategy and Land Use Bylaw are complete, public engagement sessions will be held to share the drafted policies and regulations with residents, and to gain their feedback. The exact timing of these sessions is not yet determined, but they are expected to take place in 2025.

Are you Eligible for the Property Tax Rebate? It's not too late!

More than 1,000 MODL homeowners will receive a break on their property tax bill this year—are you eligible?

The Property Tax Rebate Program is one of the ways that Council supports lower-income homeowners by granting a property tax rebate based on total household income.

Homeowners with combined household incomes under \$51,840 are eligible to receive a rebate of up to \$650 on their final tax bill. The following income thresholds are used to determine the rebate amounts:

- Under \$28,560 – maximum rebate value up to \$650, up to 100% of the bill
- \$28,561 - \$39,984 – maximum rebate value up to \$450, up to 100% of the bill
- \$39,985 - \$51,840 – maximum rebate value up to \$250, up to 100% of the bill

Applicants need to apply every year, and proof of income is required. Please note: the rebate applies to taxes levied in the current year and cannot be used against interest or tax arrears.

Application forms are available on our website or can be picked up at the Municipal Services Building in Cookville. Applications are normally due by August 1, but late applications are accepted.

What if I have questions or I am having issues voting either by phone or by internet?

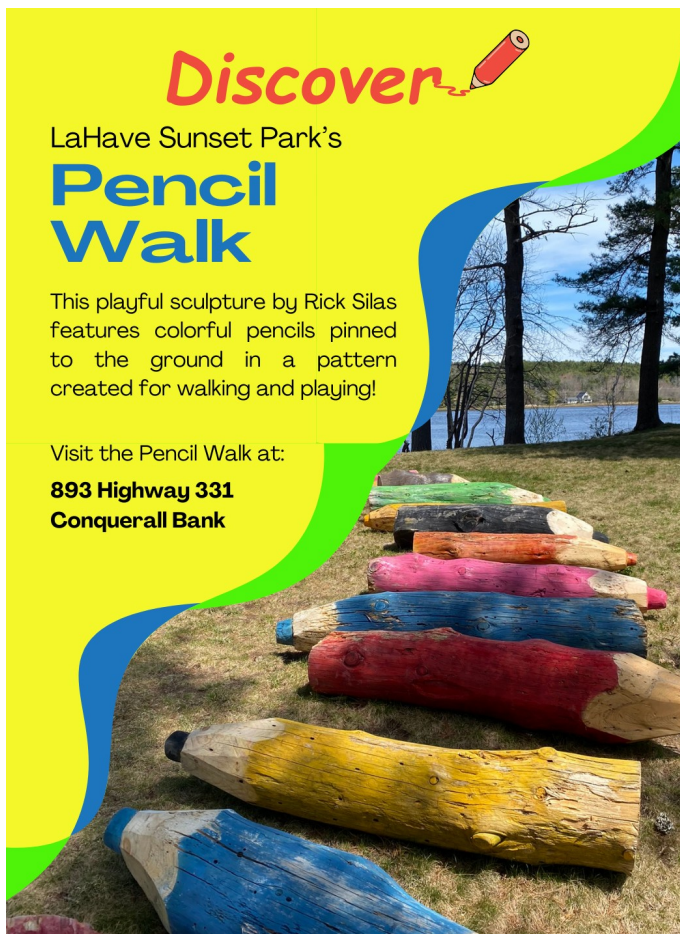
Call the Helpline number on the Voter Instruction Letter. It will be answered by staff in the Elections Office who will be able to assist you. If it is after hours, leave a detailed message and a staff member will get back to you as soon as possible.

You may also drop by the Elections Office at 197 Dufferin St, Bridgewater, Suite 308, during regular office hours which are 8:30am to 4:30pm Monday to Friday excluding holidays for those electors who do not feel comfortable voting at home, or for those who may not have the resources such as phone and internet service but still would like to cast a ballot. **Electors who are not on the List of Electors and need to be added should go to the Elections Office.** The Office will also be open on Saturday, October 19, from 8am to 7pm. An election staff member will be available to provide assistance or answer questions, if required.

Will there be Voter Help Centres other than at the Elections Office?

Additionally, there will be a Voter Help Centre in each District on Saturday, October 19, from 8am to 7pm for those electors who do not feel comfortable voting at home, or for those who may not have internet service but still would like to cast a ballot. **Voting at these locations will be by internet only and the elector must have a Voter Instruction Letter with them.** An election staff member will be available to provide assistance.

Electors who are eligible to be on the List of Electors but have not received a Voter Instruction Letter should go to the Elections Office located at Suite 308, 197 Dufferin St, Bridgewater. To learn more, visit modl.ca/elections.

Leaf & Yard Waste Collection

Leaves and yard waste are collected throughout the year. Households may put out three bags of leaves or bundles of branches when a green cart is placed curbside. Four bags or bundles may be put out when a green cart isn't placed curbside on collection day.

Paper bags must be used for leaf and yard waste collection. Plastic bags are not accepted. Individual bags may weigh up to 25 kgs (55 lbs). Leaves can also be placed in your green cart.

Branches must be tied and bundled together. Branches may measure up to 5 cms (2 inches) in diameter and 92 cms (3 feet) in length. Visit communityrecycling.ca or call (902) 543-2991 for more information.

Curbside Electronics Collection

Electronics will be collected on your regular collection day between September 30 – October 11, 2024. Each household can put out three electronics during that time. Electronics can be dropped off at a depot during the rest of the year. The waste site at 908 Mullock Road, Whyntott's Settlement accepts electronics free of charge.

Electronic Products Recycling Association has added several new types of recyclables accepted in Nova Scotia; some examples from each type:

- Floor and carpet care appliances: vacuums and carpet cleaners
- Garment care appliances: irons and steam cleaners
- Counter-top cooking appliances: food processors, coffee grinders, coffee makers
- Devices for cutting food items and opening/sealing packages
- Time measurement devices & weight scales: alarm clocks, wall clocks, food scales, weight scales
- Personal care appliances: hair dryers, electric toothbrushes
- Portable air treatment devices: portable fans, heaters, humidifiers (does not include air conditioners)

Waste Set Out Guidelines

Waste collection begins at 7am in the Municipality of Lunenburg. Be sure to put it out on time, within 10 feet of the road. Bagged waste can be put in removable plastic or metal containers at the curbside to keep critters out. Old blankets and sheets can be wrapped around your garbage bags to prevent them from being torn open. Garbage boxes may also be used.
